Join the conversation on <u>March 10th from 7:00pm – 9:00pm</u> to learn about specific resources and strategies to Keep Teens Safe. Presenters from the CKG Foundation, Hanover Cares Coalition, Hanover Community Services Board, and Hanover County Public Schools will share their perspectives on teen mental health. Panelists will discuss different aspects of teen emotional well-being including building resilience, identifying risk factors, depression and anxiety, substance use, and suicide.
